I want to thank all the volunteers from our community and those that have come in from other places to help us get things cleaned up.

In March a group of college students came along side the Advent Church and The Lions Club. They all assisted homeowners with debris removal, they crawled under houses, tore out drywall and flooring, raked yards and hauled it to the dumpsters that were placed in the City for that purpose. The Lions club donated the funds to have the 5 large dumpsters brought in and hauled away. Thank you Lions Club!

On April 2nd, we had our annual Sumas cleanup day sponsored by Nooksack Valley Disposal. Many volunteers showed up and contributed their time and energy to assist. On April 23rd, we had yet another cleanup day . The City staff and I were able to arrange additional funding to help Sumas citizens get more flood debris removed from their homes and properties. I want to thank the volunteers who came and Megan from the LTRG (long term recovery group) for coordinating the volunteers, Pacific Rim Reload for donating the site and staff for the dump location, and Jason Clawson for spending his Saturday monitoring and directing the incoming debris.

On the City side of things, we have secured contracts to restore City hall and the Senior Center, and work should begin very shortly on these projects.

The City staff and crew have been working hard to do what they can to bring Sumas back to preflood conditions and better. There are many projects in the works and they are doing a great job keeping things going for us.

Thank you to our men in blue for keeping our City safe and sound despite their own personal hardships. We appreciate you! Wow! So much to be thankful for.

Walking your Dogs

IT'S MOWING SEASON!

OUTDOOR BURNING

Outdoor burning is prohibited within City limits, except for recreational fires in designated fire pits.

Community Garden

The Community garden is open, and will be available until November 1st.

Please Keep in Mind:

- Planting areas are first come, first serve; you must mark your own areas.
- Pick up any garbage/weeds and throw it away.
- By the end of October, please pick up all of your garden supplies. In the first week of November the City will dispose of any left over items in the gardens.

Summer Sewer Rates

Sewer rates are based on water usage. During the months of April-October your sewer is billed based on your average water usage during the winter months (Nov-Mar). Your sewer bill will never be higher than your average usage in winter. That means your sewer rate won't increase if using water for filling up pools, watering lawns/flowers, & washing your vehicles.

<u>Utility Budget Program</u>

The City offers the budget plan for any resident who is interested. The budget plan <u>only</u> applies to the electric portion of your bill. The budget payment is calculated based on your previous 12 months electric usage plus 10%. This payment will begin with May 2022 bills and will be billed monthly through March 2023. April is the month that the entire account will be reconciled, and its' bill will be either a credit or debit. If at any time you decide to cancel the budget plan, any outstanding balances will be due immediately. If interested please reach out to Mollie Bost at 360-988-5711 before May 27th to sign up.

The Sumas Library and Whatcom County Library System (WCLS) staff appreciate all the support our community has shown the library since the flood. Below are updates and information about the status of the library, as well as current services and volunteer opportunities!

- Repairs have begun, and we are pleased to announce that 24/7 access to free WiFi at the library building is now available. The public access point can be reached from the library parking lot and in the grassy area next to the library.
- We are excited to share that remodeling provides WCLS an opportunity to install a Library Express in
 the building foyer. A Library Express allows patrons to pick up items they have on hold at their
 convenience, including during hours the library is not open and staffed. Patrons will use their library
 card to enter the foyer, find their requested items, and check out the items. This concept has been
 successful at the WCLS administrative building on Northwest Drive and at the Point Roberts Library.
 We look forward to bringing this increased accessibility to library services to Sumas.
- Pick-up your requested items in Sumas! You can pick up library items on hold in Sumas. Requested items are delivered to a lockbox in the library parking lot on a weekly basis. To get started, simply choose Sumas as your desired branch pickup location when putting an item on hold. A staff person will contact you to verify your choice. Questions? - Stop by the Bookmobile The bright blue bookmobile is in the library parking lot every Friday from 10am – 2pm! We would love to connect with you!
