In the fall, the Army Corp of Engineers will be hosting a flood fighting exercise in Sumas to help us be better prepared in the event of another flood. We will keep you posted of when and where this exercise will take place.

If you or someone you know still needs help please reach out, you don't have to go through this alone. There are resources available that may assist you, or others in the recovery process.

Grass Clippings

City code, 8.32.030 (A) allows compost piles in city limits with these provisions: a **compost** pile to be covered or concealed as not to affect the health, safety, or depreciation of adjoining property; Dumping lawn clippings on city property or property of another would be considered littering and subject to a possible fine.

Summer Sewer Rates

Sewer rates are based on water usage. During the months of April through October your sewer is billed based on your average water usage during the winter months (Nov-Mar). Your sewer bill will never be higher than your average usage in winter. That means your sewer rate won't increase if using water for filling up pools, watering lawns/flowers, and washing your vehicles.
