UTILITY BUDGET PLAN

The City offers an electric utility budget plan for any resident interested.

The budget payment is calculated based on the residents' previous 12 months electric usage plus 10%. If interested, notify Mollie at mbost@cityofsumas.com prior to May 26th. A proposed budget plan will be sent, and if the resident would like to move forward, the first payment will begin with the May 2023 usage bill, and will be billed monthly through March 2024. April 2024 is the month that the entire account will be reconciled, and the April bill will either include a credit, or debit. If at any time, the resident decides to cancel the budget plan, any outstanding balances will be due immediately.

SUMMER SEWER AVERAGES

During the months of April – October, sewer charges are billed based on the average water usage during the winter months (November – March).

As of our April billing cycle, we are on Sewer averages. Sewer rates are based on water usage. The sewer cost will never be higher than the average usage in winter. That means the sewer charges won't increase if using water to fill pools, water lawns/flowers, or wash vehicles April through October.

MOWING SEASON

Please maintain grass and weeds as per Sumas Municipal Code 8.32.

As we're all out mowing and working in yards, please be sure to clean up and dispose of yard waste properly. Keeping our sidewalks and roads clear of grass.

FOUR-LEGGED FRIENDS

The Sumas enclosed dog park is located next to Ballfields 3 & 4, off Hovel Road.

At the dog park, or while walking your dog, please pick-up after them and dispose of bags properly, do not leave bags on the ground/sidewalk. We want to keep all sidewalks/walkways clear for all to enjoy!

OUTDOOR BURNING

Outdoor burning is prohibited within City limits, except for recreational fires in designated fire pits.

COMMUNITY GARDEN

The Community Garden is open, located near Ballfields 3 & 4, off Hovel Rd., and will be available until November 1st.

Please keep in mind planting areas are first come, first serve; you must mark your own areas. Please pick up any garbage/weeds and dispose of them properly.

By the end of October, please pick up all of your garden supplies. In the first week of November the City will dispose of any left-over items from the gardens.

A LETTER FROM THE MAYOR



Greetings,

There's just something about Springtime. Maybe it's the months and months (and months) of cold and rain we so humbly suffer here in the great Northwest. Maybe it's that as we look around and see signs of new life popping up everywhere, it's a hope realized. Whatever the reason, we welcome Spring whole-heartedly. Make it a great one!

Just want to give you a few updates:

The City and Crew have been busy upgrading the Rodeo Grounds

with some additional seating, working on lighting, and improvements to the announcement tower. This is Phase 2, being completed with funds received in a grant from the State with assistance from our local legislators.

Regarding the Nooksack river; as you know, there have been many conversations and meetings over the past 16 months. While action has been very slow, I am happy to say that collectively the leaders of the small cities, the County, and the Nooksack and Lummi tribes, are getting on the same page of taking action to resolve the issues at the Everson overflow. The science of what happened in November of 2021 has finally come in, so we've been able to gain clarity on what the River has done, and is doing. In that particular event, they speculate that Everson, Nooksack, and Sumas experienced a 200-year flood event, while the areas downstream experienced a 50-year flood event. Naturally this causes alarm for most, including myself, which calls for urgent action. Of which, as I stated earlier, is what is occurring. We hope at a minimum that this action will take place at the overflow to equalize it, even if it is a temporary measure before the next flood season, until permanent fixes are in place. I or staff will continue to update you as developments occur.

I will close with this thought:

I have lived in Sumas most of my life now and have observed and experienced that when this community comes together for a cause or a need, it really pulls together. Our community needs you, whether it is the neighbor next door, a local business that could use your support, or a local event that needs your volunteer time. Becoming involved with our youth, helping the elderly, etc., the list goes on. All these things bring us closer together and help to strengthen us in unity, because we are doing it together and want the best for each other.
