SUMMER SEWER AVERAGES

Just a reminder - during the months of April through October, sewer charges are billed based on the average water usage during the winter months (November through March).

As of our April billing cycle, we are on Sewer averages. Sewer rates are based on water usage. The sewer cost will never be higher than the average usage in winter. That means the sewer charges won't increase if using water to fill pools, water lawns/flowers, or wash vehicles April through October.

Outdoor burning is always prohibited within City limits, except for recreational fires in designated fire pits, following the Fire Marshal's restrictions.


forests and the crucial role that natural forests play in storing vast amounts of carbon. Saturday, August 10, 1:00 P.M. – 3:00 P.M.
