Here's what's happening in Sumas over the next couple of months.

CITY MAINTENANCE

Tree trimming will take place once the leaves change in the Fall. The City will be trimming trees back from power lines and public sidewalks if they have not already been trimmed by property owners. Per Sumas Municipal Code, all property owners are responsible for trimming their own trees/shrubs. Please reference code 8.32.030 for more information.

Herbicides will continue to be applied to City property and rights-of-way as needed to maintain the areas.

YARD MAINTENANCE

Please maintain lawns and weeds per Sumas Municipal Code 8.32. Clean up and dispose of yard waste properly. Dumping lawn clippings in drainage areas, alleys, etc. is prohibited.

Just wanted to give you all an update and let you know that the Chamber of Commerce is in the process of being rebuilt and reformed. I and others are working closely with the Chamber officer to bring it back to life.

Dear Residents,

We wanted to provide you with a quick update regarding the FEMA projects in our area as we head into another year without much visible progress that most can see.

Behind the scenes, we continue to work closely with FEMA's Consolidated Resource Center (CRC). The CRC is a vital resource that helps disaster recovery efforts by providing trained experts to assist with Public Assistance (PA) projects. One of our top priorities remains the Hovel Rd project. We're actively working towards finalizing the necessary steps to begin actual construction. As many of you are aware, projects like these involve a significant amount of "red tape," including navigating through the requirements of various agencies to reach agreement on the proposed designs.

In addition to Hovel Rd, we are making progress on several other important projects, including:

- The Sumas outfall
- Arthurs Way
- Culverts on West Third St and West Second
- Well sites

Over the past year, there has been a change in some of the CRC personnel working in our area, which has unfortunately slowed down the process.

However, we're making headway, and are about 80% complete with the sewer repairs we began last year. These were temporarily halted due to the high-water table, but we anticipate full completion of these repairs by the end of this year.

Additionally, the Sumas Water Improvement District has completed survey work on the lower Sumas River and most of its tributaries. The surveyors are preparing CAD files to send to the engineering firm, allowing them to start designing up to 40% of the project. This design phase is expected to take approximately six months, with the goal of beginning work during the 2026/2027 fish window for some of the areas.

Thank you for your continued patience as we navigate the complexities of these projects. We will keep you updated as progress continues


