Here's what's happening in Sumas over the next couple of months.

DOG LICENSES

It's a new year, and time to license your dog for the first time, or renew an expired license for 2025!

Stop by City Hall any time to license your dog for the year. There is a short form to be filled out, and pricing is based on whether your dog is spayed/neutered or not. It's \$15 per dog if they are spayed/neutered or \$25 per dog if they are not spayed/neutered.

Licensing can help reunite found dogs with their owners!

FREEZING TEMPERATURES

It's that time of year when the temperatures may dip below freezing. Freezing temperatures can mean frozen pipes. It's a good idea to have an emergency water shut off at your home so that you can turn your own water off in case of emergency. If you don't already have one, consider installing one.

Sewer rates are calculated based on actual water usage. Keep an eye on your monthly water usage. If it spikes up, it could mean a water leak. Please call City Hall if you have any questions.



The team processes new applications, case reviews, changes, EBT card requests and required documents. They also take applications for the Child Care Subsidy Program and forward them to the Department of Children, Youth and Families for processing.
