42nd Annual Spring Clean Up Day

Nooksack Valley Disposal is sponsoring the Spring clean-up day on April 6th from 9:00 AM until 12 pm, located behind City Hall.

Lawn Care & Property Maintenance

It's that time of year when everything is growing again! Please maintain yards and lawns, and keep our City looking it's best! The Municipal Code with our City's regulations is available at cityofsumas.com.

A few highlights to watch for in section 8.32.030:

- All grass or weeds should be kept below 12 inches.
- Vegetation should not hang low over sidewalks or streets, or interfere with the lights from streetlamps.
- Unused appliances should not be left anywhere exposed or accessible to children
- Blackberry vines should not overgrow any area
- Garbage should be kept in appropriate receptacles, and large building scraps neatly piled and tidy.
- Motor vehicles of any kind may not be repaired on public streets, alleys, or property.
- Any unsightly and unsafe partially destroyed structure must be repaired or removed within a reasonable time - not more than one year

VoyentALERT! is used by the City to keep you informed during emergencies as well as day-to-day notifications related to road closures or water and electricity maintenance that may impact utilities.

UTILITY BUDGET PLAN

The City offers an electric utility budget plan for any resident interested.

The budget monthly payment is calculated based on the residents' previous 12 month electric usage, plus 10%. If interested, notify Arielle at abons@cityofsumas.com prior to May 29th. A proposed budget plan will be sent, and if accepted, the first payment will begin with the May 2025 usage bill, and will be billed monthly through March 2026. April 2026 is the month that the entire account will be reconciled.



SUMMER SEWER AVERAGES

During the months of April through October, sewer charges are billed based on the average water usage during the winter months (Nov. - March).

Sewer charges are based on water usage. Summer sewer averages mean that the sewer cost will never be higher than the average usage in winter. Averages are used so that using water to fill pools, water lawns/flowers, or washing vehicles won't increase sewer charges.

If you've recently moved, please be sure to visit the Sumas Post Office to let them know your new address!

Often utility bills and other notices are returned to City Hall when a resident has not completed the proper paperwork with the Post Office. We want to be sure everyone receives their mail!

COMING SOON! LOW-INCOME CLOTHES WASHER AND DRYER PROGRAM


